- a better equipped weekender: integrated aft cabins as standard with wooden hanging lockers, but also stowage in the saloon, water heater, etc.). It only keeps essential packs (fitted galley, electricity, ground tackle, etc.)
- a cruiser that offers more choices of configurations (arch & aft platform are optional on the 3 versions)

A modern hull: chined hull, twin helm station, vertical bow and the possibility to opt for a beachable lifting keel version.

- Choice of: Without mainsail arch: the mainsail traveller track is in the bottom of the cockpit. The arch option receives the clew of the mainsail, frees the
 - cockpit and integrates the lighting.

- With or without aft platform: choice of an open cockpit or a tilting bathing platform for a cruise programme
- Choice of: Deep draught, shallow draught but also a lifting keel beachable boat (1.15 m / 2.30 m. 3'9" / 7'7") real selling point for navigation in areas with high tidal range



And always in the essentials:

- 4 large hull ports for a panoramic view over the sea, long coaming windows,
- Hull chine over the full length of the boat: enhanced performance, increased stiffness and reduced heel, optimisation of the interior space.
- Twin rudders = more responsive helm. Particularly well suited to beamy hulls





The cabins are separated off to create private areas where one can enjoy some quiet time.

The forward cabin can be configured as an Open version.

A **large linear galley** opposite the saloon which can accommodate up to 6 people.

As on the Weekender and the Daysailer **the exterior layout is free** (mainsail arch, platform, etc.)

- **The Daysailer version** now allows the **Mooring Pack**. It also incorporates additional storage space (high closed stowage shelves in the saloon + functional chart table with lifting table top)

It remains adaptable on all external Packs, the Electricity Pack and the Night Pack.
- **The Cruiser versions** offer a very well equipped sailing boat consistent with the usual standard of the range.
- The majority of modules can be ordered from Spare Parts and fitted by the agent whenever the customer wishes, even as part of the after-sales service.
